We start the season of Epiphany remembering the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child. We continue to make meaning out of this strange historical event by repeating the phrase, “Wise men still seek Him.” And indeed they do. Later this month a small delegation from the Montana Synod will be visiting our companion Synod, the Cape Orange Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Southern Africa. It is our way of “still seeking Him.”

The Cape Orange Diocese is our original companion synod, since the beginning of the ELCA. (It was some years later that we also took on the Bolivian Church as a second companion synod.) Over the years numerous delegations from the Montana Synod have visited our companion synod, and several folks from South Africa have visited our synod. This will be my first visit to this companion synod, and it will be the first face-to-face interaction between our churches since the election of their new Bishop, Bill Bowles.

There are many reasons that a visit like this is important, especially in Epiphany. The first reason is **accompaniment**. The ELCA is committed to accompaniment as a model for doing ministry. Particularly in our global relationships we emphasize accompaniment, which is relational. Accompaniment is based on the premise that partners each have something to share. Global mission is no longer the “haves” sharing with the “have-nots.” Rather it is partners walking together and sharing gifts with one another. And of course there

is no better way to learn to walk together than to practice it, to do it. So we are going to South Africa to be faithful partners with our companion synod.

“Wise men still seek Him.” Christianity has its origins in the Middle East. For much of the first two millennia, Christianity flourished in the northern hemisphere, first Europe, then North America. Many of our assumptions about Christianity are northern European/North American in origin and orientation. But things have changed. Christianity is growing, and growing fast in the global south. While

churches in North America and Europe are losing members, churches in the global south are growing. So we are visiting a part of the world where Christianity is thriving, where churches are growing. Part of our walking together will be experiencing a church that is growing and vibrant. We have much to learn from our partners in the south.

“Wise men still seek Him.” Jesus said we would find him where we find the poor, the oppressed, the marginalized.. Therefore we expect to encounter Christ in the people of South Africa, who have lived through tribal rivalries, colonialism, apartheid, poverty,

disease, violence, AIDS. We expect to encounter Christ in the experience of the Church, proclaiming the Good News for all people.

I ask your prayers for our visit, and for our companion synod in South Africa, and our Companion Synod in Bolivia. And I also ask for your prayers for our Synod, and for the ELCA. We are all members of the Body of Christ.

Worship at the Work Ranch

“Pastor, would you pray for my little girls? They are going through a hard time right now”. “Please pray for me, too. I’m leaving the ranch tomorrow. Pray that I continue to live the right way when I get out”.

These prayer requests were offered at worship at the Work Ranch dorm at the Montana State Prison which I was privileged to lead recently. The opportunity came for volunteers to be responsible for leading worship at the work ranch at the Montana State Prison in Deer Lodge the first Sunday of each month. As a member of the Montana Synod Freedom in Christ Prison Congregation Task Force and as the nearest ELCA pastor to the prison, I agreed to coordinate Lutheran volunteers. The prison reached out a hand to us, and I believe we needed to take this ministry opportunity seriously.

I typed up a handout with an outline of the service. Last Sunday I was privileged to share the body and blood of our Lord Jesus with watery fizzy prison “grape juice” (could it have actually been soda?) with 16 men who treasure the gift and promise of forgiveness of sins from the depths of their hearts.

With your support so much more could be done. I am hoping to prepare the way for the one who comes after me as pastor for our prison congregation. We are growing the ministry as Bible study materials have been ordered, volunteers are signed up to attend training later this month, and plans made to begin a Bible Study in February. Both Campus Ministry groups agreed to bring teams to lead worship once a year and we have a group of retired pastors who are pitch-

ing in as volunteers!

The Freedom in Christ Task Force is working to raise funds to call a full time pastor to develop a mission congregation at the prison. Until that happens we will minister in this place as volunteers through this service and through the Bible Study. Your prayers, your financial support and your willingness to let others know about this important ministry can help to make it happen. If you would like to help with worship or with Bible Study, we would welcome your participation.

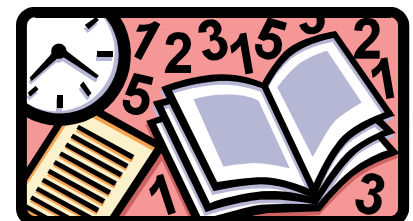

ELCA Church Council report

I would like to share a few impressions with you from my first meeting at the ELCA Church Council of November 13-15.

These were difficult days in our ELCA offices, as we decided to reduce the budget by 10%, and many positions were cut. Bishop Hanson spoke of how many who learned that their positions would be terminated, handled this news with humbling grace. In the new budget, we sought to be mindful of our strategic priorities. We have kept our commitments to new congregational starts, to churchwide staff assigned to synods for mission and stewardship work (our ELCA Director for Evangelical Mission: Dave Peters), to campus ministries, seminaries, companion churches and missionaries.

In reflecting on these decisions, Bishop Hanson said it well. "However one interprets the numbers, the consequences are the same, mission is diminished, lives are impacted and faith is tested." Concerning Ministry Policies, we passed a reinstatement process revision and considered drafts of ministry policy documents. You may read and comment on these at www.ELCA.org/ministripolicies

The time spent in Chicago was rich, and the schedule was full. Days began with breakfast meetings at 7 a.m. I met in a small group discussion with Beth Lewis, CEO of Augsburg Fortress. (Every congregation should, when possible, use Augsburg materials - consider it like "shopping locally.")

Much like a Synod Assembly, I

walked away from this weekend with a sense of gratitude for the varied and faithful ministries of our Church. I was glad to have met so many wonderful people who serve our church with passion and faith.

It crossed my mind that, part of my sadness in the face of some leaving our ELCA, is that these are people much like those I met on this weekend, passionate partners in the Gospel. May God guide us as we seek to minister together in the love which God has brought into our lives in the person of Jesus Christ.
